Application Share How...

1. Open the website or application(s) you wish to share.

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2. Click  or use **Tools** → **Application Sharing** → **Host Applications...**

How...

3. From the dialog box, select the appropriate tab for sharing an application or a region.

- To select an application, click the **Applications** tab. All the applications currently visible on your desktop will be listed. Choose the application you wish to share.

- To select a region, click the **Region** tab. You will be shown a graphical representation of your desktop's window layout. Click on the region you wish to share or resize it to define your own region. The selected region will be highlighted.

To quickly share your entire desktop, use **Tools** → **Application** → **Sharing** → **Share Entire Desktop**





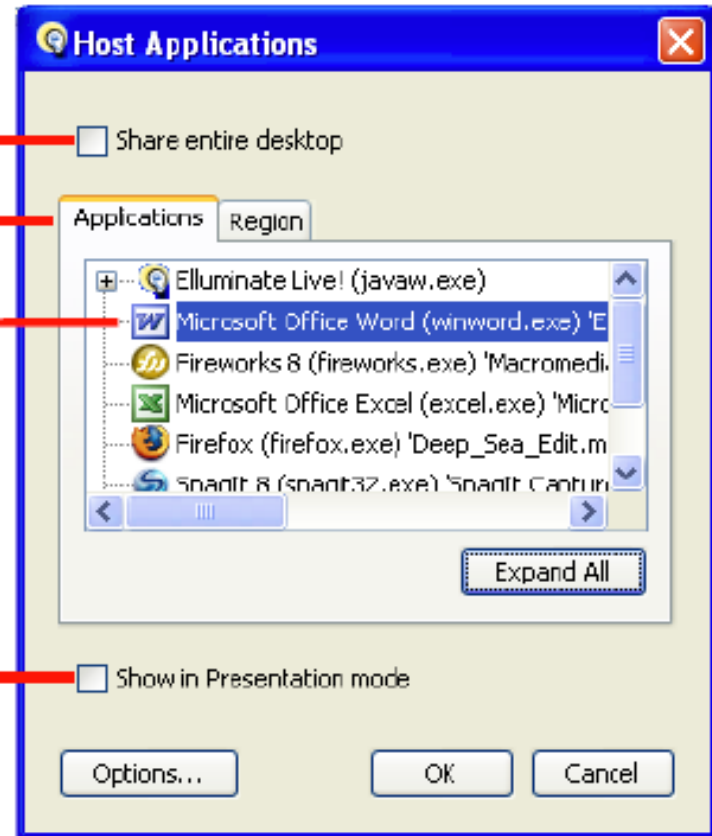
Application Share How...

Sharing by region allows you to share multiple applications and windows simultaneously. When sharing by application, any new windows that open relating to the application will also be shared.

Share your entire desktop
Select the Applications or
Region tab


From the Applications tab,
select the appropriate
application(s) from the
displayed list. Similarly,
from the Region tab click the
region you wish to share
from the graphical display of
your desktop's window
layout.

Select Presentation mode
for full screen viewing.



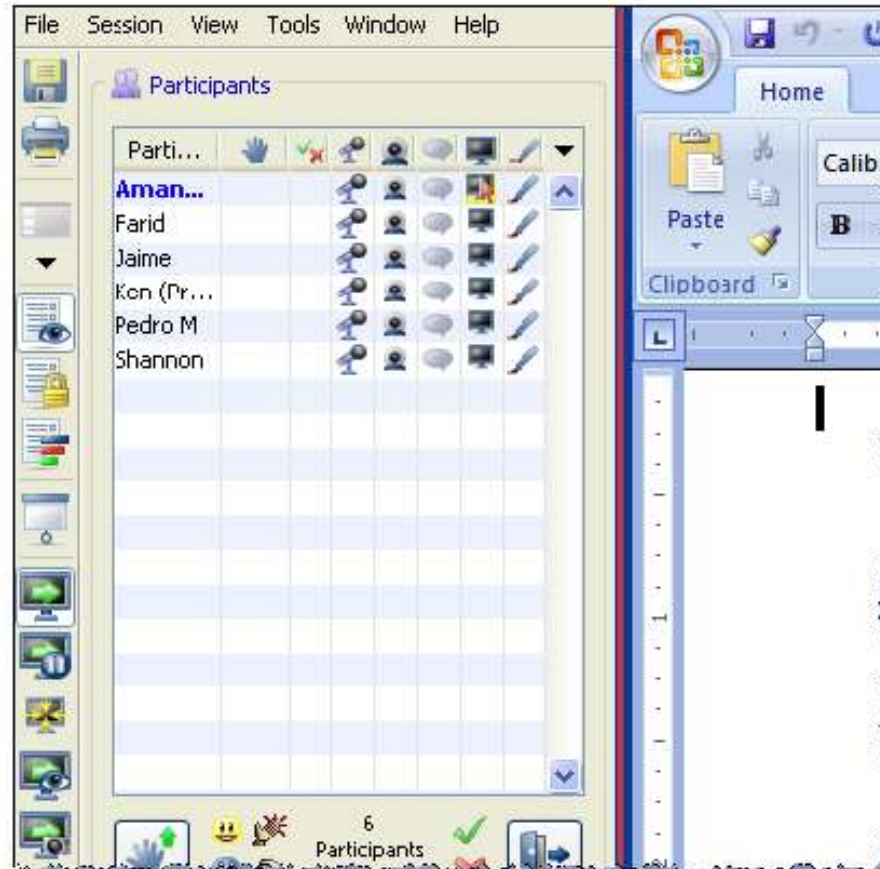

How...

4. Click **OK** to begin sharing. The icon next to your name in the Participants window will change to  to indicate that you are sharing and controlling your application(s). As you make changes to the application(s), the other participants will be able to see those changes as they are being made.

5. The default hosting options will automatically resize and reposition your windows based on the application or region you chose to share. You can change the hosting options based on your preference by clicking the **Options** button on the **Host Applications** dialog box.

5. To pause Application Sharing, click  on the toolbar. The participants will see a still-shot of your application(s). Click the button again to resume sharing. Any changes that were made in application or region while the application was paused are sent to the participants.

How...

6. To stop Application Sharing, click .





Application Share Activity Indicators



In this example:
The orange indicator next to Farid's name shows that he has not received all of the content from the shared area. The red and orange indicators appear next to Jaime's name, indicating she is more delayed than Farid. Ken and Shannon have received all of the information and therefore have no indicators next to their names.

While you are sharing an application and making changes, you may see red and orange activity indicators next to your name or each participant's name. These colored indicators lights represent the length of the delay.

Give Control to Participants

When you give control of your shared application(s) to another participant, he or she will be able to move your mouse and interact with the shared applications.

To give control:

1. In the Participants window, click on the name of the participant to whom you wish to give control.

Give Control to Participants

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To give control:

1. In the Participants window, click on the name of the participant to whom you wish to give control.
2. Right-click on the name selected and select **Give Control of Shared Applications** from the menu that appears or select this option from **Tools** → **Application Sharing**.



Application Share Regain Control

To regain control of your shared applications use one of three methods:

1. Press CTRL + Spacebar on your keyboard.



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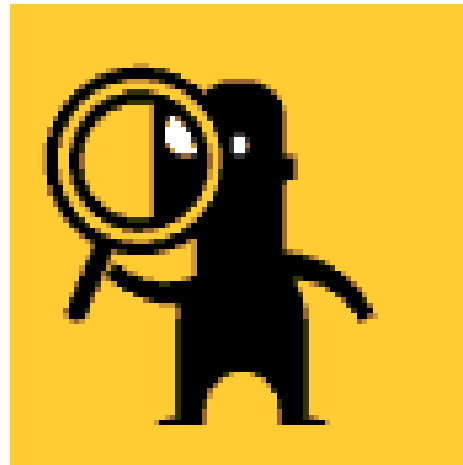
2. Click the  button from the toolbar.

3. In the Participants window, click on the name of the participant who is currently controlling your application. Right-click and select **Take Away Control of Shared Applications** from the menu that appears.



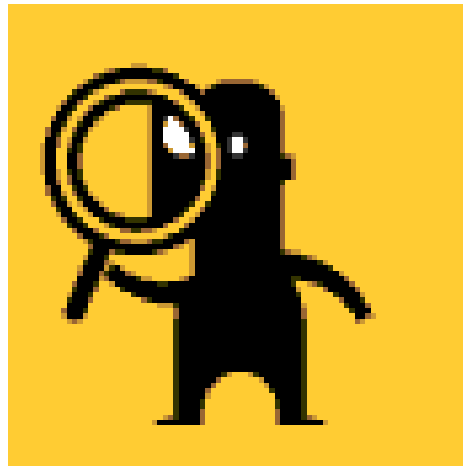
Application Share Tips...

To give or take away hosting permissions to a participant, click next to the participant's name in the Participants window in the Application Sharing column. The presence of this icon  gives permission. Click it to take away the permission.



Application Share Tips...

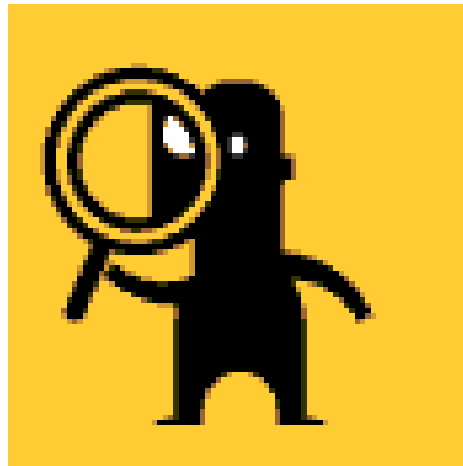
When another attendee is controlling your application, use the audio hot key F2 to turn on and off your audio.



Application Share Tips...

To view what your participants are seeing, click the Preview

button- 



Application Share Tips...

When sharing an application running full screen, click

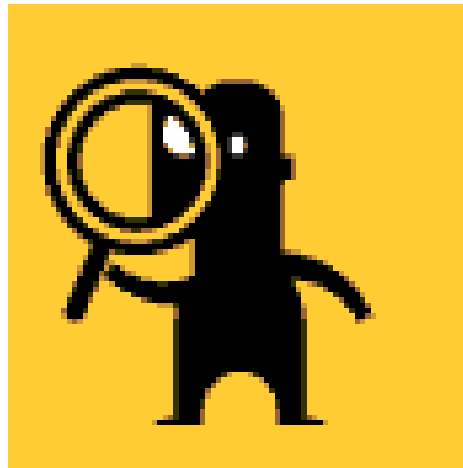


The mini-controller allows you to monitor session activity without displaying the moderator interface.




Application Share Tips...

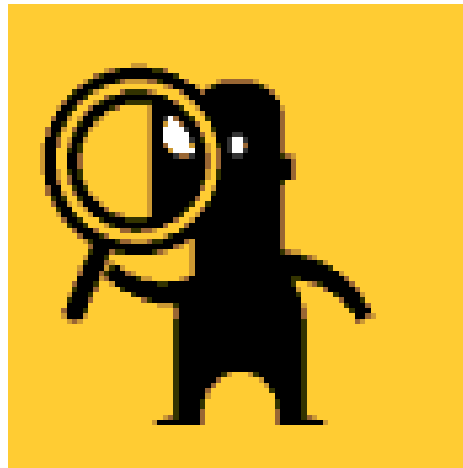
Another full screen option is to share in Presentation mode -

Click  to snapshot the application to the whiteboard for annotation and discussion.



Application Share Tips...

The cursor of the shared application can be distinguished from the computer cursor by setting the Application Sharing options to Emphasize Cursor. The cursor will be displayed

in this manner -  Tools>Preferences>Hosting
Options>Emphasize Cursor.



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Web Tour and Web Push

What's the difference?

The Web Tour window will appear in front of the Main window. In a Web Tour, you, as the tour guide, have more control of what the session attendees will see. If they are viewing the web site via the Web Tour window, they can browse on their own within the site. The moment you move within the Web Tour window (click on a link or push them to a different URL), they will move with you.



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With a **Web Push**, the Internet URL opens up in the session attendee's own web browser. This window is outside the *Elluminate Live! session and the session attendees have full control of their own windows* - they can type URLs into the browser, use their own bookmarks and close the window.

Why...

Web Tour

- Viewing site with audio such as youtube.com
- Ensuring students are following you as you review a site during a lesson
- Any other ideas???

Web Push

- Ensure student received correct URL
- Push out site for student to work independently such as logging into Study Island.
- Any other ideas???

How...

Starting a Web Tour

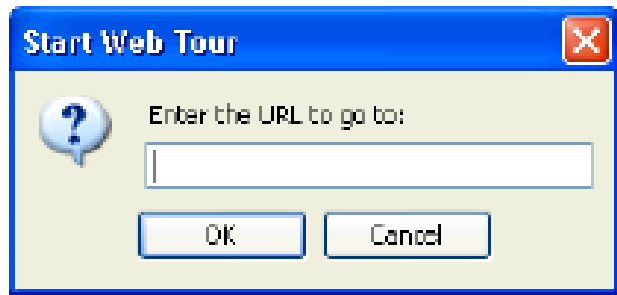
The Web Tour window will appear in front of (on top of) other open windows. To start a Web Tour with a specific web site, do the following:

1. Click on the  button in the toolbar or, alternatively, from the Tools menu select Web Tour > Start Web Tour.



Web Tour How...

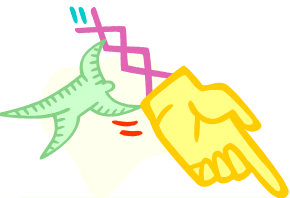
2. In the Start Web Tour dialog box, enter the URL that you wish to display to your session attendees and then click **OK**.



The Web Tour Window will open with the specified web page.



Session attendees can move to other pages in the Web Tour window, but will be redirected when the tour guide makes a change.



Quick tip: To paste a URL do the following:

1. Copy the URL by highlighting the URL, right click and copy
2. Go back to the Start Web tour window and click Ctrl + V to paste into the window.



Web Tour

Within the Web Tour window, you can do the following:

- Move within the web site by clicking on the various links. The links will be stored. Within the same session, you can use the arrow buttons to move to these links.
- Move within the web site by using the page arrows.
- Move to another web site by entering the URL in the URL text box. The URL will be stored and you can access the URL via the arrow buttons.
- Publish a URL to the Chat panel by clicking on the Publish URL button.
- Close and resize the Web Tour window.

➤ To become the tour guide, select the Tour Guide check box in the Web Tour window. If you do not have the Tour Guide option selected, you will be moving only yourself and not anyone else in the session.



Web Tour

Publishing URL to Chat Panel

You can publish URLs from your Web Tour to the Chat Panel so they are accessible to everyone. Only Moderators can publish a URL to the Chat panel. You must enter your URL and press Enter to load the web page before the  Publish URL button is enabled. (When the URL address field does not contain a valid URL, the Publish URL button is disabled.)

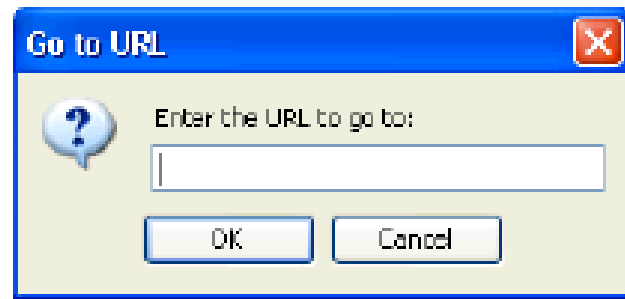

Web Push How...

To perform a Web Push, follow the steps below:

1. Open the Go to URL dialog box by doing one of the following:
 - ✓ From the Tools menu, select Web Tour and then Go to URL... (all platforms).
2. In the Go to URL dialog box, enter the URL that you wish to display to your session attendees and then click **OK**.



The URL will launch in the session attendee's default browser.



If you currently have the Web Tour window open and then you do a Web Push, the Web Tour window will close.
