#### Scoring:

Your writing will be scored on how well you

- make a statement about the topic,
- include at least three main idea sentences about your topic,
- include at least two detail sentences in support of each main idea sentence,
- organize your essay using an introduction paragraph, body paragraphs, and a conclusion paragraph,
- vary your sentences,
- use correct grammar, spelling, punctuation, and capitalization.

#### Writing Task:

Read the following writing task. You must write an expository essay about this topic.

#### Writing an Expository Essay

It can be very difficult for young people to get a job especially when the economy is struggling. A teenager seeking a job will have to present themselves well on job interviews and on job applications. Write an essay in which you explain about some things a person should do in order to perform well on job interviews and applications.

When you write your essay, remember to,

- make a statement about the topic,
- include at least three main idea sentences about your topic,
- include at least two detail sentences in support of each main idea sentence,
- organize your essay using an introduction paragraph, body paragraphs, and a conclusion paragraph,
- vary your sentences,
- use correct grammar, spelling, punctuation, and capitalization.
